

How to Make a Reusable Jeopardy Game Board

Materials List for Reusable Jeopardy Game Board:

1. Poster board (size may vary based on desired board size)
2. Ruler
3. Markers or colored pens
4. Index cards or small pieces of cardstock
5. Tape or glue
6. Scissors
7. Categories and clues for Jeopardy game

Step-by-Step Instructions:

1. Determine the size of the Jeopardy game board you want to create. Measure and cut the poster board to the desired dimensions. A typical size for a Jeopardy board is around 24 inches by 36 inches, but you can adjust according to your preferences.
2. Divide the poster board into a grid pattern. Using a ruler, draw horizontal lines across the board to create the rows and vertical lines to create the columns. For a standard Jeopardy board, you will need 6 rows and 5 columns. Ensure that the lines are evenly spaced and straight.
3. Assign categories to each column. Use the markers or colored pens to write the category names on a piece of paper. Place them at the top of each column so the name is clearly visible. Common categories in a youth ministry Jeopardy game can include Bible Trivia, Church History, Youth Group Activities, Saints, and Christian Values, among others.
4. Prepare the clue cards. On index cards or small pieces of cardstock, write down the clues corresponding to each point value and category. You should also prepare a list with the answer for each clue.
5. On the back of each clue card, write the point value in a bold marker. Traditionally, Jeopardy game point values are 100, 200, 300, 400, and 500, but you can modify them based on the difficulty level you desire for your game. So your cards should have the question on one side and the point value on the other.
6. Attach the clue cards to the Jeopardy game board. You can use tape or glue to affix the clue cards onto the corresponding point value spaces. Make sure they are securely attached, so they don't fall off during the game. The point values should be visible. Each card should be under its corresponding category, in ascending point value.
7. Add any decorative elements or designs to the Jeopardy game board. Use your creativity to enhance the visual appeal of the Jeopardy board. You can draw borders, color-coded sections, or illustrations related to the youth ministry theme.
8. Have each team select a category and point value. Read the corresponding question aloud, and the team that buzzes in or responds first gets the opportunity to answer. If the answer is correct, award the team the corresponding points. If the answer is incorrect, or if they fail to answer within five seconds, the point values is subtracted from their scores. In this case, another team may buzz in to answer. Continue playing until all questions have been answered or for a predetermined time limit.
9. Use your best judgement to determine if the response is correct or not.

- It's helpful to plan the categories and clues in advance to ensure a balanced and engaging game. Prepare a list of questions and answers based on the chosen categories to make the Jeopardy game flow smoothly.
- Consider laminating the poster board or using a clear adhesive sheet to protect it from wear and tear. This will allow you to reuse the board multiple times.
- You may want to create a separate answer sheet or keep a digital record of the correct answers for reference during the Jeopardy game.
- Prepare game buzzers or a system to indicate which player responded first to the clue correctly. This could be done with handheld buzzers, bells, or simply having players raise their hands.
- Have a whiteboard or large piece of paper nearby to keep track of the scores as the game progresses.
- Ensure that the Jeopardy game board is placed in a visible location during the game so that all players can easily see the categories, point values, and clue cards.
